

London to Brighton Cycle Ride Sunday 14th September 2025

Dear Resident

The Skyline London to Brighton Cycle Ride will take place again on Sunday 14th September 2025 will see thousands of riders completing the challenging 55-mile ride from Clapham Common, through south London, Surrey, West & East Sussex to the Brighton finish on Madeira Drive - in the process raising over £1 million for a wide variety of good causes.

The event starts on Clapham Common at 06:00, with the first cyclist in Surrey by 06:30 and the last cyclist should be clear of the area by 14:30.

The route remains as last year where road closures will be in place on Hazelwood Lane, Markedge Lane, Rocky Lane, Cormongers Lane, Fullers Wood Lane and Clay Lane.

Resident & Business Access Only 05:30 – 13:00 Hazelwood Lane, Chipstead; Markedge Lane; Rocky Lane

06:00 - 14:00

Cormongers Lane; Fullers Wood Lane; Clay Lane

The A25 will operate as normal with traffic light control at Cormongers Lane allowing vehicles and riders to cross safely.

All other roads used by the event will remain open to traffic in both directions but will be busier than usual and travelling in the same direction as the cyclists may lead to delays. You may wish to take this into account if planning to travel through the area. The section south towards Turners Hill and Ardingly has several managed junctions and delays should be expected so we recommend an alternative route if you plan to use this route during the event.

If you are walking on the route, please take extra care as the road will be busy with cyclists at peak times.

The route will continue through South Nutfield and use Crab Hill Lane to join Prince of Wales Road, travelling south via Outwood, Smallfield and leaving Surrey just before Copthorne Common Road. We would strongly recommend avoiding Turners Hill Road for travel south as it will have two traffic control points and delays would be expected negotiating this and the cyclist on the route.

The event then travels through Haywards Heath to give riders access to Brighton over the famous Ditchling Beacon climb, which will be closed throughout the day, following Lewes Road into Brighton as the cyclists make their way to the finish on Madeira Drive.
